
Damascus, Inc. is a non-profit 501c3 organization group dedicated to assisting men with individual plans to treat the cause of their problems and addictions.

Mission Statement

Damascus will be a safe place for healing, finding love, acceptance, restoration, and receiving God's Word from the Bible. Damascus will be a place to restore dignity, self worth, values, morals, confidence, and discover their God-given purpose in life.

Damascus will prepare men for re-entry into society as Christian leaders who are an example of Christ's love and who are ready to be a disciple to everyone they encounter.

Damascus will work in cooperation with other community organizations

as the resources of our community are combined to best assist each resident with their recovery process.

Studies tell us that putting men in jail does not change their lives as most return over a period of time. Each year the Dyer County Jail books about 4500 admissions. These admissions equal about 2250 individuals of which 22-25% return to jail within a year, swelling to 32-35% within a three year period. It increases to 40% within seven years of their release. In the period from 1997 through 2006, Dyer County incarcerated 10,274 separate individuals which represents almost 28% of the county population. First time entrants will add 800-900 inmates to the Dyer County Jail. Society is telling us that this problem will increase due to more involvement in drugs, alcohol and higher unemployment. Current programs inside the jail and prison system are not working. It is time locally to address our problem of increased jail inmates and intensity of crime. If Dyer County is to move forward we must confront the face of crime and offer men a way out of their defeated lives.

These lives need changing toward a direction in life that offers hope and construction of values never firmly rooted.

Damascus offers many opportunities to target and work with a segment of our society by presenting these men with life-changing instructions, values and job-skill training coupled with full time employment.
